Behaviour Principles Written Statement

- ✓ Every child, member of staff and visitor understands they have the right to learn, the right to be treated with respect and the right to feel safe. Likewise, they have the responsibility to ensure other can learn, others are treated with respect and others feel safe.
- ✓ All children, staff and visitors are free from any form of discrimination.
- ✓ Staff and volunteers set an excellent example to children at all times.
- ✓ Rewards, sanctions and reasonable force are used consistently by staff, in line with the 'Behaviour' and 'Positive Handling' policies.
- ✓ The 'Behaviour Policy' is understood by children and staff.
- ✓ The 'Behaviour Policy' explains that exclusions will only be used as a last resort, and outlines the processes involved in permanent and fixed-term exclusions.
- ✓ Children are helped to take responsibility for their actions.
- ✓ Families are involved in behaviour incidents to foster good relationships between the school and children's home life

The governing body also emphasises that violence or threatening behaviour will not be tolerated in any circumstances – this is inclusive both of pupils attending the school, parents/carers or any other member of the community.

This written statement of behaviour principles is reviewed and approved by the Curriculum and Standards Committee every year in September.
